The awards are funded through tax-deductible donations made by sponsors of Venice Musicale ensembles as well as by audience members who attend our free monthly variety and Suncoast Duo Pianists concerts and by sponsors of local performances by Venice Musicale's Encore Chorus. Encore is a perennial favorite of area organizations looking for top-quality entertainment, and, along with Suncoast Duo Pianists, is available to book for special events between November and April each year.

Since its inception, the Venice Musicale Scholarship Program has provided nearly \$300,000 to promising young area musicians.


